My Suicide Attempt Is Transforming an Organization by Vince Hafeli

1989 was a challenging year. My brother was pronounced terminal, my father passed at 59, and my wife and I lost twin sons.

In 1993, my brother passed on his daughter's fifth birthday, and we learned that my mother had cancer and would soon lose her battle.

During this period, I was a rising executive in the construction industry. I did not share my story or struggles. Instead, I acted the way men in this industry "are supposed to"; I was macho and robust, not looking to share, be perceived as weak, or lose the next promotion.

Time marched forward, and these events weighed on me. In 2007, while experiencing a failing marriage and after another uncomfortable conversation at the dinner table, I

decided I would take my life. I drove away from my house to where my life would end when I received a phone call that saved me.

Did you know in 1793 the first settlement in Ohio to publish a newspaper was in Cincinnati?

Ohio was still part of the vast Northwest Territory when the first newspaper in present-day **Ohio** was published in 1793. The date was November 9 and William Maxwell's newspaper the "**Centinel of the North-Western Territory**" was the first product of the printing press anywhere north of the Ohio River & west of the Allegheny & Blue Ridge mountains. The city of publication was Cincinnati, but just a few years earlier its name had changed from "Losantiville". The newspaper would continue until June of 1796, although records show the newspaper was sold to Edmund Freeman in 1796 who changed the name to "**Freeman's Journal**". Records show, however, that it did not publish until July of 1800 and lasted less than 6 months.
