Risks & Challenges of Construction Tech Adoption by Rose Hall

Today, the construction technology market is flooded with different tools. In fact, in 2020, early stage construction tech funding was \$374.9 million, while late stage funding was \$417.4 million; then in 2021, early stage funding increased to \$738.3 million, and late stage funding reached \$1.1 billion.

This increase in options is challenging contractors to determine which ones are right for them. While it's not a bad problem to have, too many choices can complicate successful adoption. As contractors are still dealing with some pressing issues that may have previously stood in the way of adoption like an aging workforce, talent shortage, notoriously slim profit margins, etc., more contractors are seeing realistic opportunities to turn to technology to help address these issues.

# My Suicide Attempt Is Transforming an Organization by Vince Hafeli

1989 was a challenging year. My brother was pronounced terminal, my father passed at 59, and my wife and I lost twin sons.

In 1993, my brother passed on his daughter's fifth birthday, and we learned that my mother had cancer and would soon lose her battle.

During this period, I was a rising executive in the construction industry. I did not share my story or struggles. Instead, I acted the way men in this industry "are supposed to"; I was macho and robust, not looking to share, be perceived as weak, or lose the next promotion.

Time marched forward, and these events weighed on me. In 2007, while

experiencing a failing marriage and after another uncomfortable conversation at the dinner table, I decided I would take my life. I drove away from my house to where my life would end when I received a phone call that saved me.
